
For all boys and girls, it is necessary to have the correct kit for Games. This includes shin pads and boots for boys and shin pads and gum shields for girls. Safety is paramount!

ASSEMBLIES THIS WEEK

Monday (Years 3&4) & Friday (Years 5&6): We talked again about dreams, remembering last week's assemblies about Martin Luther King. What do you want to be when you are older? Many children said they want to be happy. We talked about Jesus' advice:

The people who are happy are those who long for justice, those who are kind and merciful and those who work for peace (Based on Matthew 5.6-8)

I have heard You calling in the night

I will hold Your people in my heart

Mr Wright related the story of Samuel and how he was called upon by God in the middle of the night. We talked about how we all needed to be aware that whenever we could help that this was time for us to act, a time when many would believe we were being called upon by God.

Wednesday (Reception – Year 6): Mr Wright talked about the value of dreams and we watched a retelling of Joseph interpreting the Pharaoh's dreams. We considered Jesus' advice: One day, Jesus said to his special friends, 'I want you to be happy like me, so I will tell you what to do.
