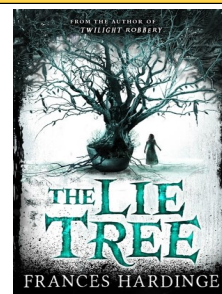
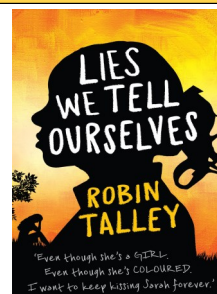
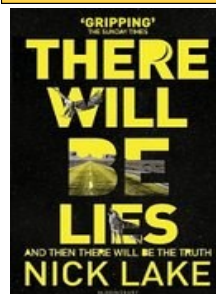

Carnegie Day



Lies and dishonesty to others and to ourselves was a theme in this year's extraordinary Carnegie list. On the 14 June the Shire Hall was full of book groups from across the county discussing the very challenging books that we have been reading over the past weeks.

Author Tanya Landman – last year's winner – was an entertaining afternoon speaker. She was 'under embargo' to all questions about the Carnegie medal, however, as she is one of the judges for the new Amnesty International award that is being linked to the Carnegie for the first time this year.

Herefordshire's nomination for the winning title was *The Lies we Tell ourselves* by Robin Talley, a book which tells the story of the first black pupils to attend Jefferson High USA and begin the process of integration – but with a twist.

Second place was the verse novel *One* by Sarah Crossan and third was *Five Children on the Western Front* by Kate Saunders.

We await the final decision from London next week. Do try reading the Carnegie List over summer and make your own mind up!
