## FROM THE HEAD: CHANGE AND CHANGE AGAIN

As I write this first thing on Friday morning, it is hard to believe that it is only 5 days ago (Sunday morning) that the Prime Minister clearly stated on the Andrew Marr show that primary schools would be returning to school this week.

As parents may know, many schools across the country were unable to open or to open fully due to safety concerns and staff shortages. The Junior School staff spent our INSET day on Monday, talking through concerns and reviewing our routines and systems in school so as to further minimise the potential for spread of coronavirus, and, as I wrote to parents on Monday evening, we were all looking forward to welcoming the children back to school on Tuesday morning.

Clearly the situation was changing around us, and the Government changed its policy. All of us – School Heads, teachers and other school staff, parents, and children found ourselves having to react quickly to the announcements of Monday evening. I am sure that for many of the children the news was unsettling and upsetting – I remember one of my older children (now in his 20's and a teacher himself) so looking forward to the first day of each term, that he would go to bed wearing his uniform under his pyjamas to get to school more quickly the next day! Some of your children, I am sure would not have been aware that they were not coming back to school until Tuesday morning itself.

I should like to thank parents for your understanding and for your forbearance as we respond to this new situation in school. You should have received our Learning at Home booklet on Tuesday, and your children should all now be up and running on Firefly and Zoom. We will be developing our provision and making various changes over the next few weeks, some of which are detailed below, so please continue to bear with us as we do this.

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## REMOTE LEARNING PROVISION
