EXAM RESULTS 2019

HCS CELEBRATES PUPILS' HIGH A-LEVEL SCORES

Hereford Cathedral School students celebrated outstanding successes in this year's A-Level results, with over 70% of all entries being awarded A*-B grades and nearly half of all students securing nothing less than a B grade.

Art, which is a particular strength of the School, performed exceptionally well this year, with all candidates achieving at least an A grade. Three students, William O, current Head of School Lily M, and Emily L, who joined HCS Sixth Form from Malvern St James, secured A* grades in the subject. Harriet G who was Deputy Head of School this year and international student

Wendy F, who had not studied Art before joining the school two years ago, both gained A grades.

Business Studies and Economics results were also strong for HCS this year, with 80% A*/A grades in Economics and 83% A*-B in Business.

The School is impressed with its students' overall achievements, with 100% A*-B grades in seven subjects. Headmaster Paul Smith said: "I am very pleased for our students, who have worked diligently to achieve excellent results and who are now able to embark on their future careers."

Kezia R-W, who achieved all A*/As at GCSE, has continued her success at A-Level with As in biology and economics and a B in chemistry. On top of her studies, Kezia had to fit voluntary work and work experience into her schedule in order to secure her university place: "I've done over 200 hours of work experience, volunteering at the Riding for the Disabled Centre and I've worked in veterinary clinics around

Hereford. The school have been really supportive of me, it's been fantastic."



Despite spending up to 12 hours a week in training as a two-time Brazilian ju-jitsu world champion, Liberty M has stormed through her GCSEs. Liberty, who competes every two to three months, still managed to find the time to study, gaining 10 grade 9s and two grade 7s. An elated Liberty said: "It has been quite crazy, but the school have given me so much support that made it so much more bearable than I thought it would be." Liberty joined the school in Year 9 from Bishops and settled in immediately: "HCS has been really welcoming so I couldn't have asked for anything else!"

ANOTHER EXCELLENT YEAR FOR GCSEs AT HCS

Hereford Cathedral School students celebrated another year of excellent GCSE results in 2019, with almost half of all entries awarded the highest grades of 9-7, and nearly a third of all grades at 9-8 (A* equivalent).

Fourteen exceptional pupils achieved all 9-7 (A*/A) grades, with 13 pupils boasting five or more top grade 9s. In 11 of the school's subject departments, over 50% of entries were awarded grade 7 and above (equivalent of grades A*/A). Results for the Maths Department were outstanding, with over 85% of grades in further maths at the very top grades A^/A*/A.

Headmaster Paul Smith said: "I am delighted to see so many pupils achieve or exceed their targets. Congratulations to those high-flyers, each of whom has achieved a large number of the top grade 9. However, I also applaud those pupils who might not have reached these dizzy heights of academic achievement, but who nonetheless have excelled in their GCSEs."



OUTSTANDING RESULTS FOR WILL AND ALFIE

The school's top-performing GCSE pupils, Will P and Alfie O have achieved a staggering 23 grade 9s between them. A brilliant mathematician, Will recently scored in the top 1.5% of the UK Intermediate Mathematical Challenge and was handpicked to take part in the UKMT Maths Summer School at the University of Leeds. Will was delighted to have achieved an A* in maths and

the top grade A^ in further maths: "I put in a lot of work, but it's worth it in the end. I've been here since Year 7 and I've enjoyed every second. The teachers have been really helpful in every subject."

Alfie said: "It was a lot of hard work and I know lots of people say this, but there genuinely is that support there to really help you when the going gets tough."

The HCS Art Department also enjoyed similar success, with 22 pupils achieving grades 9-7. Many of the GCSE art students will continue to study fine art and textile art in the school's sixth form and are hoping to go on to match the success of this year's leavers, who achieved 100% A*/A at A-Level this year.
