
FROM THE HEAD


MRS WALKER'S HEDGEHOGS

ASSEMBLIES THIS WEEK

Tuesday (Reception - Year 6): We talked about our 8 days of Change for Change initiative and about the work of the Royal British Legion in particular.

Wednesday (Reception - Year 6): Remaining with our Change for Change theme, we discussed the work of the RSPCA. The children also watched a film prepared by Mr Benjamin Pardoe (Volunteer Coordinator at St Michael's Hospice), in which he answered the questions the children had asked during our St Michael's Hospice assembly last week.

Friday (Years 3&4): We talked about our Change for Change initiative and we worked out how much money has been donated so far, taking each day at a time. The children went on to estimate how many coins we might receive for the remaining days and to calculate an approximation of how much money we might raise altogether.
