FROM THE HEAD

This week there have been two national initiatives that we have been supporting in school; Children's Mental Health Week and Internet Safety Day. While we may question why two such important initiatives are scheduled in the same week, it is fair to say that there is



certainly some correlation between the two. As you will see from our assembly summary we have focussed on Mental Health in assemblies, while in ICT lessons the emphasis has been on Internet Safety.

It is noteworthy that so many of the suggested activities that promote good mental health, such as exercise, singing, staying away from screens and socialising are interwoven into each and every day at the Junior School. The theme for this year was 'Growing Together' and emphasising that growing is not only a physical development. Open lines of communication are, of course, incredibly important and the older children were challenged to think about who they might consider to be in their support balloon, essentially who they could turn to when they needed help. As I said to the children, everyone has mental health and therefore, just as we do all that we can to remain physically healthy, so we should ensure that we apply this approach to our mental health too.
