Mr Debenham went on to explain that Lent is a period during the year when Christians remember a time of preparation that Jesus experienced - 40 days and 40 nights in the wilderness. The assembly concluded with the children considering what they might give up or do for Lent.

On Wednesday Years 3-6 attended an Ash Wednesday service led by the Dean, featuring the choristers. The service gave the pupils an insight into the dedication and



commitment that each chorister makes on a daily basis, as well as demonstrating how their singing promotes and enhances worship in the Cathedral. It was a privilege for the children to hear the choristers performing the responses and a psalm. Dean Sarah explained about the significance of the 40 days of Lent

and concluded the service by talking about the traditions associated with Ash Wednesday and 'ashing' four volunteers.
